THE CROSSOVER RESEARCH ROADMAP

- The new challenges of policy-making: regulation and governance in a complex, unpredictable world
- The new opportunities of ICT for policy-making: policy modeling and collaborative governance can leverage collaborative analysis and collective intelligence
- However, expected results not there yet: little evidence that open data and collaboration leads to better policies
- A strong need to consolidate the community, reinforce its identity and reach out to actual and potential users
- What are the bottlenecks to greater impact, and what research is needed to overcome them?

TODAY

- Open data, citizens collaboration have great opportunities to improve policies: what are the bottlenecks and the solutions to achieve that? What research is needed?
- A bottom-up exercise: mapping research and comparing it with the proposed roadmap. Checking overlaps and discrepancies. Examples:
 - Open data > all workshop
 - Big data > Smart cities
 - Opinion mining and sentiment analysis > public engagement session
 - Visual analytics > data journalism, make sense
