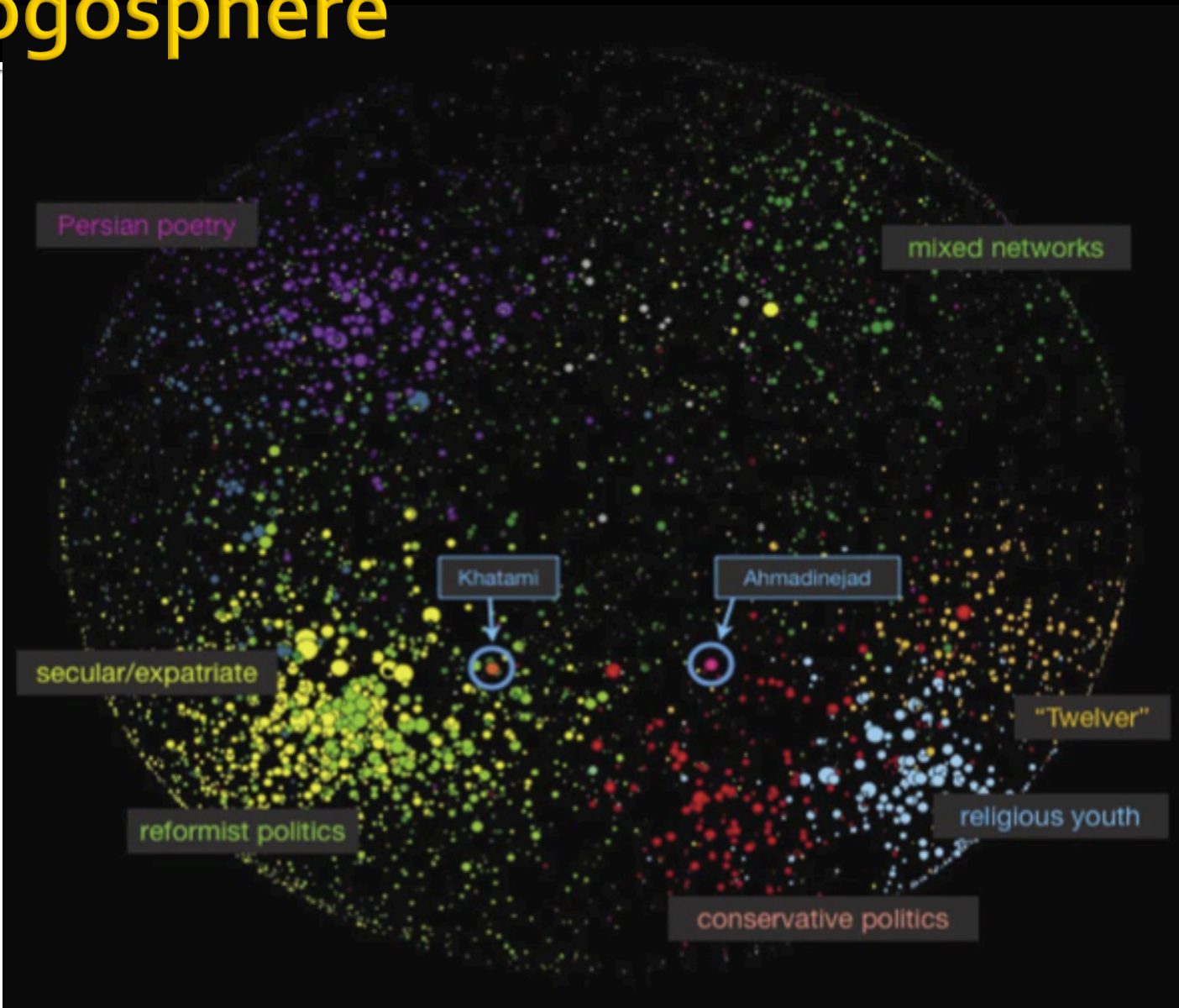

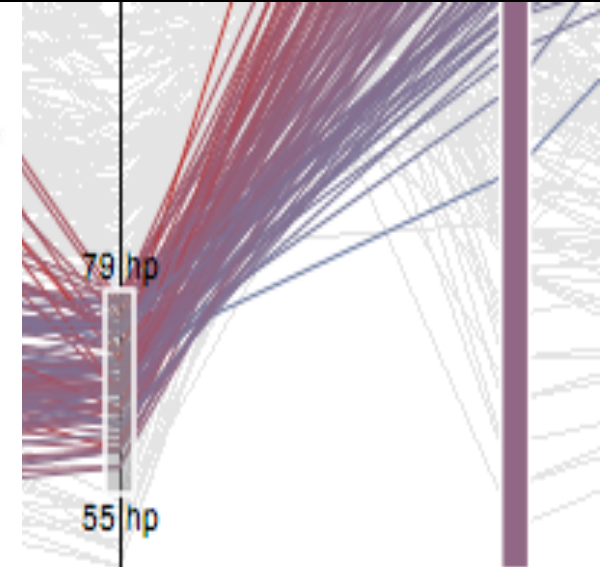
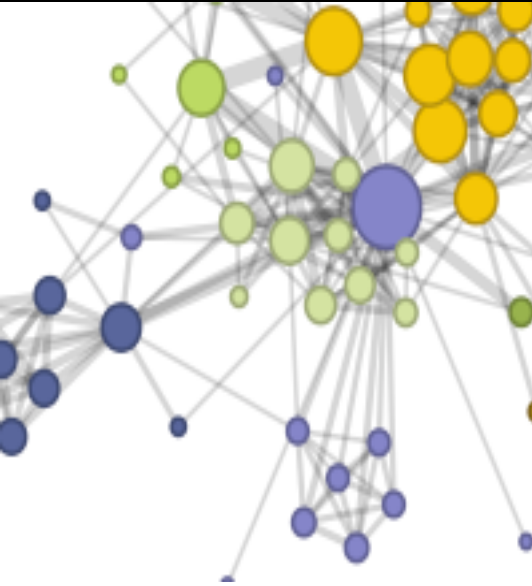
Guiding Questions

- How can culture be incorporated as a variable?

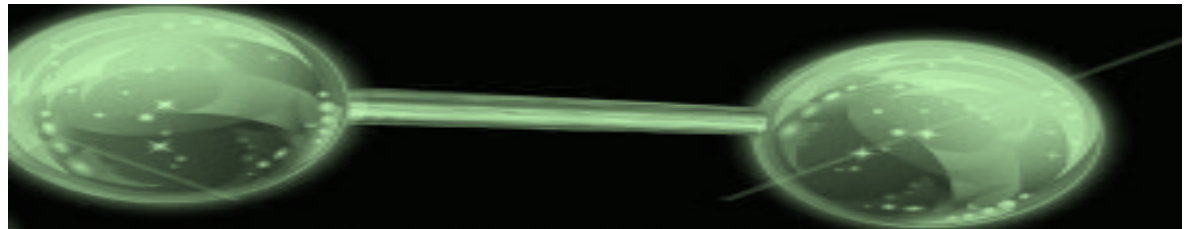
Physics Model of Iranian Blogosphere



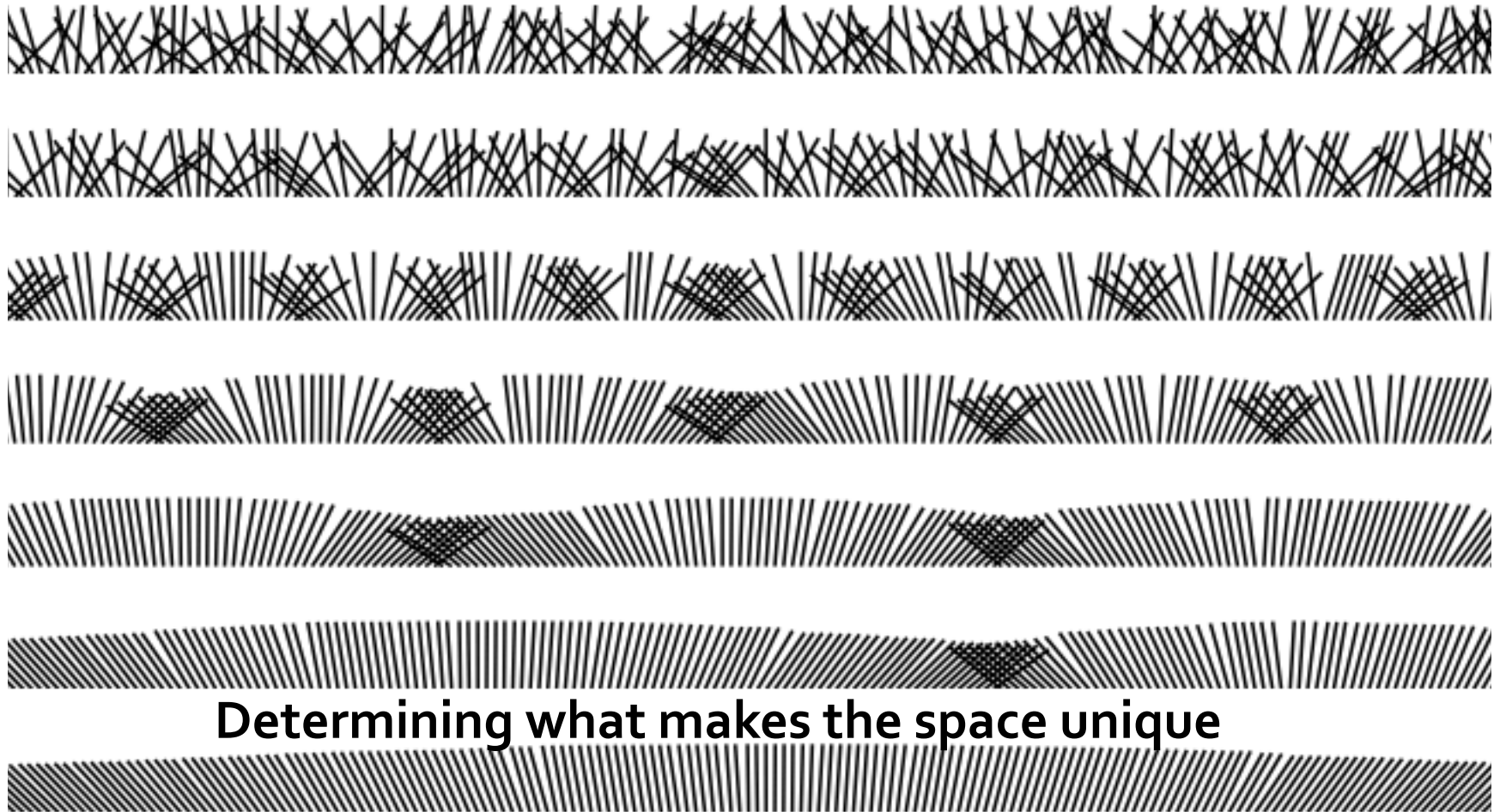
Dichotomies, Poles, Nodes

New model

- Semantic filter first
 - rate of word change for key words
- Semantic filter for location
 - Diaspora connections become more apparent
- Strategies surrounding censorship
- Place blogs within ecosystem
